Illustrious Grand Master's Message



Greetings Companions—

Summer has come to a close once more with the anticipation of its return next year. We now enter into the season of autumn, a time of transition from summer to winter. The trees become colorful and eventually lose their leaves to the autumn wind, the days grow shorter, and a chill returns to the air. All being displays of familiar change. Similar to the seasonal change is the continuing discussion of change in Freemasonry and in the York Rite. The “buzz words” surrounding this concept of change have been retention, education, paradigms, connectivity, technology, social media, communication, security, perceptions, traditions and so forth. These notions are nothing terribly new. We have been hurling them about for years, but these days they are certainly being emphasized to a much greater magnitude. Men today, regardless of age, are doing their homework. They are using the tools and technology they are familiar with. The Internet has made the world a very small place, so they go online; read articles; research the pros and cons; delve into our historical significance; view You Tube videos showing men dressed in tuxedos and white gloves performing precision driven floor work to grandiose music amidst elegant and palatial surroundings. They witness learned men of stature reciting meaningful and profound dissertations meant to provoke thought and capture hearts. They’ve probably gone on Facebook or other social media and observed images of Table Lodge banquets lined with well-dressed, distinguished gentlemen enjoying Masonic camaraderie and fine food, toasting and singing odes to the fraternity and the Glory of God.

The prospects of today come hungry for knowledge and preloaded with wonder and awe and great expectations before they ever knock at our door. They are anticipating great leaders who will offer them guidance and mentorship. Men have forever been lured by the core ideals of Freemasonry. They are expecting Freemasonry to fulfill its purpose and do what it actually claims to do and has done for generations. And when that anxious and excited Master Mason seeking further “Light” in Freemasonry wanders up to knock on the door of your Council, what will he find? Companions, my concern and belief is that we are not confronted with a membership problem, but a new member retention challenge. So even when we do gain a zealous disciple, and if that new Companion can somehow manage to overlook the worn out carpet, peeling paint, dead flies on every windowsill, shoddy ritual work, empty chairs, lack of education, inconsistent dress code, and absence of the intellectual enrichment he’s craving, and decides not to commit “Masonic suicide”, but stays on because he sees an opportunity for himself to benefit the Council with fresh ideas and build Freemasonry in accordance with its teachings and tenets, will we empower him to do so? Will we support him? Encourage him? Will we help him with such an endeavor? Companions, the answers should be YES! Because in doing so, that new Companion will bring Master Masons whom he knows and share the same desire to affect positive change in themselves, their community, and the world. They then become the much needed spark plugs and fresh batteries to crank the engine and mobilize our energies to practice Cryptic Freemasonry at optimum levels. Membership retention within our Councils is the challenge requiring our focus. Why would a Council want to gain new members when it cannot keep the ones it already has? What would be the point? I have learned and come to know that no Illustrious Master and no Most

Illustrious Grand Master can make someone care. No one can. However, what we can do as Cryptic Freemasons, is set our standards higher, lead by example and inspire others to do the same. The core Companions, the ones who actually show up and want to improve themselves, their Council and the world; YOU are the ones who have to labor even more earnestly. YOU are the operatives that must have a shared vision and a plan to enact for the future and your own destiny. Doing nothing is not a plan. Waiting for something to happen, or for some magic Grand Council miracle cure, is not a plan. Councils that have not had a new candidate in a while, should be the most prepared to deliver the best Cryptic Masonic experience for that new Master Mason. When Master Masons observe Cryptic Masons in motion, engaged in improving themselves, inside and out, they will be more likely to ask the question we are all yearning to hear, "Excuse me, but what is a Cryptic Mason? How do I become one?" Companions, be prepared to smile with polished confidence when you answer.

Grand Commander's Message



Greetings Sir Knights,

Back to School

September or even late August means back to school for children and adults who attend school. For many Sir Knights as well as Blue Lodge masons, it is also a time when we return to our respective Commanderies and Lodges. Labor resumes and we continue the Orders and degree work that we put on hold back in July.

We also start preparing for the Official Visiting season, which here in Washington begins in June. We have hopefully prepared and educated our candidate in the Capitular and Cryptic Rites (Chapter and Council) and are now prepared to move into the Chivalric Rite (Templary). We also must prepare ourselves.

In the time of declining membership, many Commanderies must rely on assistance from other Sir Knights to help fill the gaps. This is where the “schooling” takes place. We must educate (or tutor) our new Sir Knight or Sir Knights that have not participated for a while into what they need to do to become an active part of the “student body” (Commandery).

When we tutor the Sir Knights, we must begin with the basics. Once they master them they will move on to more advanced tasks. It will be the same when getting them involved in the work of the Orders. Start them out with a non-speaking part, or minimal speaking part, and then advance them to the next “grade” with more challenging parts.

We must also refresh ourselves, by reviewing what our skills are and then maybe trying a higher skill set or station in the conferring of the Order. We must also remember that each Sir Knight (student) has his own speed of learning and retention of what we are attempting to convey (teach) them. It's just like when we were in school: we all reached our own level, and there is nothing wrong with that. Some are good at ritual and some are good at something else. We must recognize that and as a “teacher” build on those strengths, while gently working to improve the weaknesses.

When it's time for your Commandery's Inspection, that will be the final test of how well you have prepared your "student's" and yourself. And to work as a "team" (meaning with Sir Knight's from other Commanderies) you must study and prepare together. The ultimate goal is to give your best so the candidate (new Sir Knight) will receive the best Order possible and to achieve the best "grade" possible for your Commandery as well.

Services Provided

- **Information & Referral** – staff are available to assist individuals in identifying resources available to them in their community including care providers, housing options, support groups, nutrition and more.

The MRC is owned by the Grand Lodge. The disposition of proceeds from any future sale of the MRC will be decided upon by the Grand Lodge.
